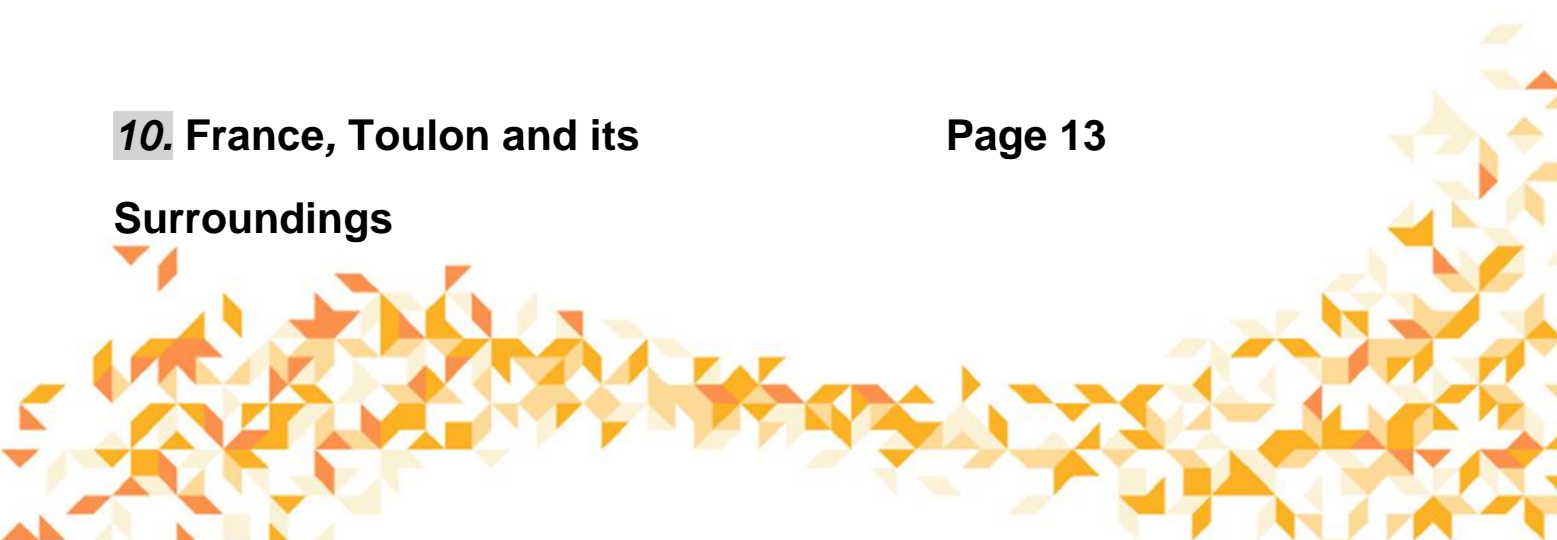

## 2. BEFORE YOU LEAVE...

You need to complete a number of steps before you leave for France :

### 1. Visa (for non-European students) :

If you want to study in France more than 3 months, you must obtain a student visa before coming to study in France. This is necessary for obtaining the *temporary residence permit* which will lead to a *long-stay student visa* once you are in France – something we will help you with. This request must be made within 2 months after arrival.

a. If you obtain a tourist visa you will not be able to obtain a *long-stay student visa* once on French territory.

b. Students from the European Union do not require a *long-stay student visa*. For more information, contact the French consulate in your own country.

**2. Financial resources.** : proof of resources enabling you to live in France for the stated period. Plan to have some cash to cover living costs on arrival in France (approximately 500€)

You may be able to obtain a grant / scholarship from your national government, the French government, or other sources. Make inquiries at embassies and cultural services as well as from private foundations.

**3. Health insurance.** You will need to show that your possible medical expenses are covered either by subscribing to the French student social security scheme (203€) or, if you are over 28 years of age, by having personal insurance. For Europeans: you need to produce a proof of Health Insurance (European Insurance Card).

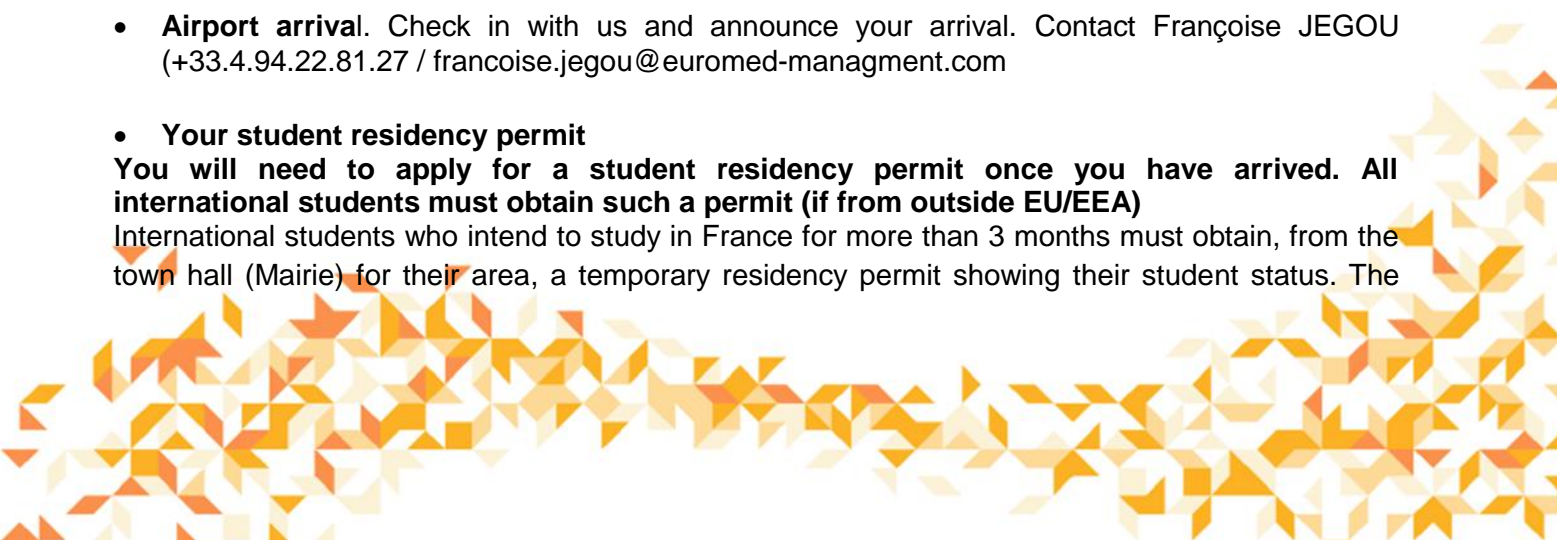
**4. Documents to bring with you.**

- Valid passport with student Visa (for non European students), several copies of your birth certificate or marriage certificate, translated into French and certified as identical with the original, all having been issued within the last 3 months.
  - Your degree/diploma certificates
  - 2 passport-sized photos
  - your bank’s details (name and address of the bank, account, IBAN, BIC... numbers)
- Note : Be sure that your passport (or Identity Card for EU nationals) is valid at least three (3) months longer than your stay in France.
- a birth certificate translated in French

### 3. AND UPON ARRIVAL

Once you’re here, complete the expatriation process in this order:

- **Airport arrival.** Check in with us and announce your arrival. Contact Françoise JEGOU (+33.4.94.22.81.27 / francoise.jegou@euromed-managment.com)
- **Your student residency permit**  
**You will need to apply for a student residency permit once you have arrived. All international students must obtain such a permit (if from outside EU/EEA)**  
 International students who intend to study in France for more than 3 months must obtain, from the town hall (Mairie) for their area, a temporary residency permit showing their student status. The



temporary residency permit is valid until the expiration date of the applicant's passport or until the date of completion of the applicant's academic program, whichever comes first. The permit must be renewed annually.

- **Medical / Health**

Individuals living in France must have coverage for medical expenses, and this includes students.

Several scenarios are relevant:

⇒ **Under than 28 years old (on 30 sept. 2011) and staying for an academic year:**

1. **for non-European students:** you are entitled to French Social Security. Registration with Student Social Security **LMDE** (<http://www.lmde.com>) or **MEP** (<http://www.mep.fr>) is obligatory when registering with the Establishment of Higher Education. The cost of French Social Security for one year is 203 euros (academic year 2011-12).

2. **European Union or the European Economic Area:** you must furnish European form E128 and / or E111, available from your national health security administrations. This dispenses you from enrolling in French Social Security.

⇒ **More than 28 years old (on 30 sept. 2011) and staying for an academic year:** you must purchase private health insurance either in France or your home country before your arrival in France.

⇒ **Student mutual insurance company**

French Social Security reimburses around 65% of medical fees. If you wish to purchase supplementary health insurance in France ("*Mutuelle*"). You have the choice between two popular providers: **LMDE** or **MEP**.

- **Financial Banking**

You will need to open a bank account once in France and are entitled to do so if staying for more than three months. To do so, you'll need the following documents:

- Valid passport
- "Carte de séjour étudiant" (a student residency permit if from outside EU/EEA)
- Proof that you are an ESCT student
- Proof of address (e.g. telephone bill, electricity bill, rent receipt, housing certificate ("certificat d'hébergement").
- Banks are normally open Monday to Friday from 09:00 until 16:00. Some banks are open on Saturday in which case they are closed on Monday.

In case you are accommodated at a private flat :

- copy of identity papers of your landowner
- proof of your landowner address
- copy of your contract

## 4. ACCOMMODATION

**Students :**

- We can suggest that you reserve a room on campus : Hall (Hébergement): double bedroom with a sink and closed Showers, WC and kitchen are shared. Rent: 301,65 €, Deposit : 240 euros (2011/2012). For reservation you'll have to send 3 months of rent + the deposit = total 1144,95 €. Without this payment, we cannot provide a room for you.
- **You'll also need a specific housing liability insurance (from €30 to €60 for one or two semesters), we help you for this. Housing Allowance:** Your rent expense may be significantly reduced through French government housing allowances: the "*Aide Personnalisée au Logement*" (APL). The precise amount of the monthly assistance varies according to the student's income, the type of housing, and the amount of the rent.

**Telephone**

Note the following:

- The country code for France is "33"

- National calls are composed of 10 numbers with the first two indicating the region in France. For example, Toulon is “04”, Paris is “01”...
- For international calls exclude the first “0” and add the country code. Calling Toulon from the UK, for example: ....+33 4 94 xx xx xx.
- The code for International calls from France is “00”.

### Internet :

The Campus provides DSL connections in conference and students rooms with restricted hours of use.

French “cybercafés” cost between € 4 and € 9 per hour.

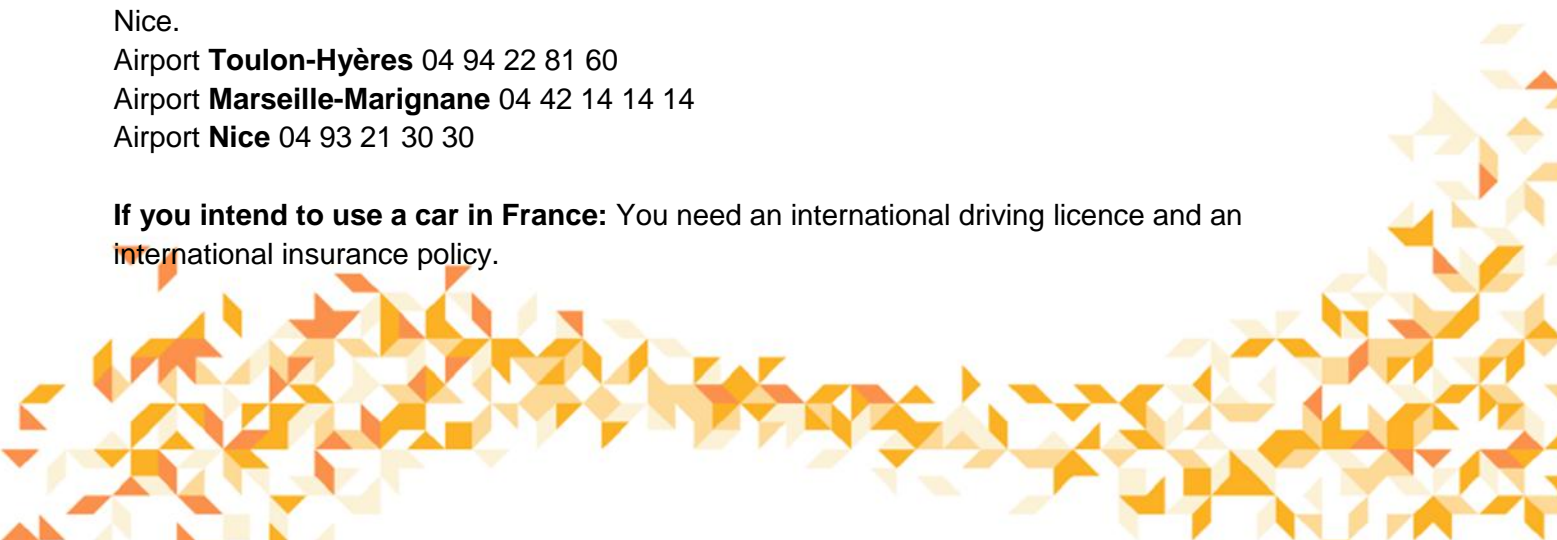

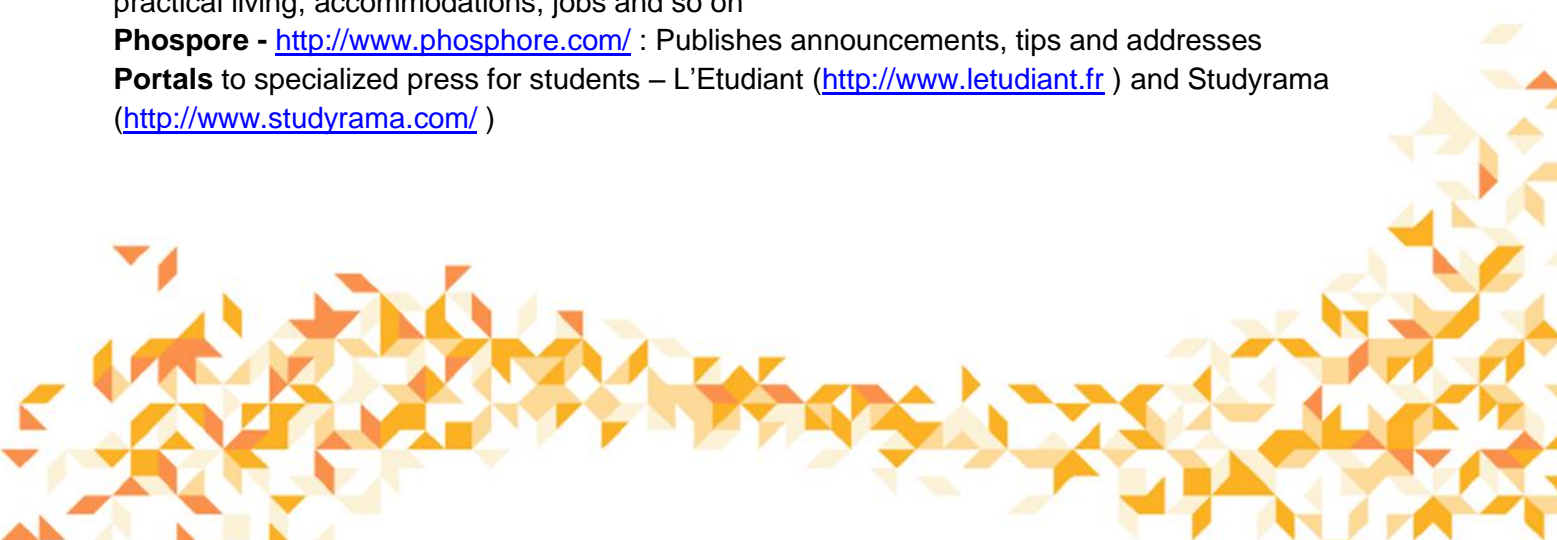

## 9. PRACTICAL INFORMATION

- **Security**

France and Monaco have low rates of violent crimes, although the general rate of criminality has been rising in the last years. The most usual ones are robberies to tourists in museums, monuments, restaurants, hotels, beaches, train stations, airports and underground.

Some advice: Those travellers who wish to have a stay without trouble, should follow a few basic rules:

- the best way to deal with money is through traveller checks, and to change them when money is needed;
- if possible, leave the value articles (jewellery, traveller checks, credit cards, airline ticket, etc) in the safe-deposit box of the hotel or place where you are lodging. Do not leave luggage in a car without watching.
- Subscribe a travel insurance in order to cover the expenses of any eventual loss or robbery.

- **Cost of living**

Our students report that the following is a reasonable guide to everyday costs:

**Food**

€ 15 / day on average

Fast Food or bakery: € 6 to € 10 a meal

Restaurants: € 15 to € 45 a meal

Supermarkets: around € 40 / week if you prepare all meals yourself.

**Transport**

Bus: € 2.00

Taxis: € 20 at a minimum.

Cinemas: € 4,50 - € 10

Museums: € 4 to € 12

Night Clubs: € 12 to € 25

**Laundry**

Laundry services are easily found.

**Telephone**

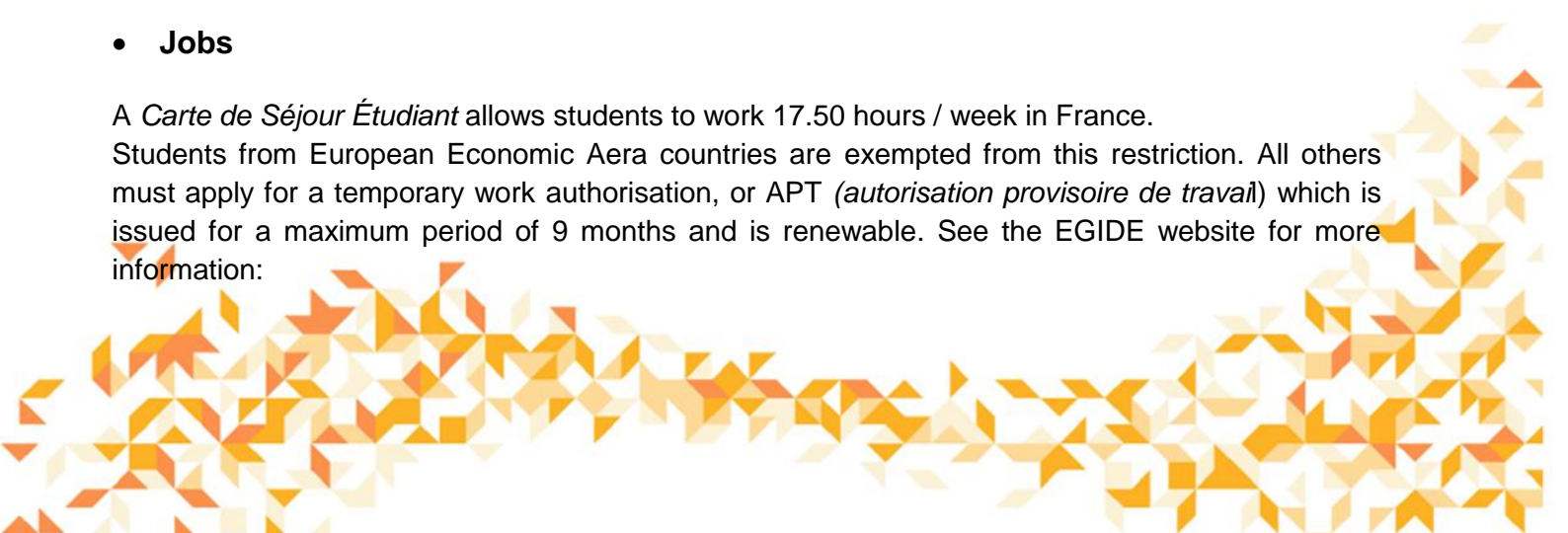
International telephone cards from France Telecom: € 7.50 and € 15

Local telephone cards (either unit card or code card): € 7.50 and € 15

- **Jobs**

A *Carte de Séjour Étudiant* allows students to work 17.50 hours / week in France.

Students from European Economic Area countries are exempted from this restriction. All others must apply for a temporary work authorisation, or APT (*autorisation provisoire de travail*) which is issued for a maximum period of 9 months and is renewable. See the EGIDE website for more information:



Students applying for authorisation are required to produce the following documents:

1. Promise of work signed by the employer
2. Residence permit (*Carte de Séjour Étudiant*)
3. Valid student's ID
4. Written request for authorisation to work

Note that the French national minimum gross salary is approximately € 1,280 / month.
